

Instructional Design Graduate Certificate

Instructional Design graduate certificate is an online 12 credit hours graduate certificate of study designed for instructional/training designers by utilizing instructional design to analyze, design, develop, implement, and evaluate resources, courses, and programs for a variety of learning delivery modalities. The program curriculum includes 4 prescribed courses, which provide the essence of state-of-the-art knowledge, skills, and ability in instructional design, program evaluation, instructional technologies, and presentation design and delivery. Upon completion of instructional design graduate certificate, students will be ready to work as professionals in instructional/training designer, trainer, learning technologies in profit and nonprofit organizations, government agencies, and educational institutions.
